### **GUIDE FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT REPORTS INVOLVING STUDENTS**

### Immediate Response to Reports of Sexual Assault

If a student tells you that they have been sexually assaulted, or if you believe that they may be about to disclose a sexual assault, while letting the student know that you are not a confidential resource, take the following immediate steps:

- 1. Ask the student if they are injured or need medical attention
- 2. Ask the student if they are in a safe place or in danger
- 3. Remind the student you are not a confidential resource and offer to connect them with someone who is
- 4. Offer to refer the student to someone trained to receive reports of sexual assault, either confidential or someone who will be required to report the incident

# **Immediate Response Instructions**

If you assist the reporting student directly, and the student is aware that you are not a confidential resource, use the following information to assist the student:

1.	Ask about injuries and the need for medical care, regardless of whether or not they have any visible injuries, and regardless of whether or not they are physically with you or the report is made over the phone, electronically, etc.  ☐ If the student reports injuries or needs medical attention, call Community Safety (503-788-6666), call 911 (#911 from campus phone), or contact one of the other resources on the Sexual Assault Aftermath Resource List
2.	Ask if the student is in any physical danger, especially if they are not physically
	with you.
	□ If the student is in danger or if there may be a danger to the community, call Community Safety or 911 and report the danger to receive help
3.	Tell the student that you* are required to forward their report immediately to
	either Community Safety, the Dean of Student Services office, or the Title IX
	Coordinator. Also tell the student that the law requires you to report to the police
	or Department of Human Services if they are under 18 years of age.
	☐ If the student wants confidentiality or is uncertain about to whom they wan
	to make a report, offer to refer them to the Reed Health & Counseling Center or another confidential resource on the Resource List
	□ *If you are a licensed clinician who is exempt from mandatory reporting,
	tell the student that you will <b>not</b> disclose the report without written
	permission from the student, <b>and</b> that the report will <b>not</b> be investigated
	unless you or the student also contact a mandatory reporter or police

	assault reports, and who can provide the student with help and support:
