We are seeking nominations – by faculty – for student papers that address SUNTA’s interests, including urban life, space and place, transnational social processes, impacts of globalization, and refugees and immigration. Robert M. Netting Best Student Paper Prize	The Culture and Agriculture section of the AAA	Submissions should draw on relevant literature from any subfield of Anthropology, and present data from original research related to livelihoods based on crop, livestock, or fishery production and forestry and/or management of agricultural and environmental resources. Papers should be single-authored. Papers already published or accepted for publication are not eligible. Only one submission per student is allowed. Those submitting papers need not be members of the American Anthropological Association but must be enrolled students.	Sept. 15
SfAA Tourism and Heritage Student Paper Competition	Society for Applied Anthropology	Student papers should entail original research on the themes of "tourism" and/or "heritage" broadly defined, including topics such as heritage, archaeology and tourism, ecotourism, and cultural resource management. AARG Undergraduate Student Paper Prize	AIDS & Anthropology Research Group of the Society for Medical Anthropology	Papers are evaluated according to the following criteria: (1) Potential contributions to the literature/policy/direct impact on HIV/AIDS prevention and/or treatment (2) Originality of argument and/or data analysis (3) Relevance of cultural, ethnic, gender and/or sexual orientation issues (4) Justified use of methods (when applicable) (5) Theoretical approach (when applicable) (6) Attention to previous research (7) Presentation--grammar, style, etc. (8) Suitability for submission to peer reviewed journals or other professional publications (including newsletters, monographs, etc.)	Oct. 15 (odd years only)
Peter K. New Award	Society for Applied Anthropology	The award will be given to the best paper which reports on an applied research project in the social/behavioral sciences. The research and the paper should use the social/behavioral sciences to address in an applied fashion an issue or question in the domain (broadly construed) of health care or human services.	Nov. 30
McJimsey Award	ASIANetwork	Papers may be on any topic from any academic discipline, but must focus on South Asia, Southeast Asia, East Asia, or the Asian Diaspora.	Jan. 15
Kenneth W. Payne Student Prize	Association for Queer Anthropology	The Kenneth W. Payne Student Prize is presented each year by the Association for Queer Anthropology (AQA) to a graduate or undergraduate student in acknowledgment of outstanding anthropological work on 1) a lesbian, gay, bisexual or trans* topic, or 2) a critical interrogation of sexualities and genders more broadly defined. Harold K. Schneider Student Prize in Economic Anthropology	Society for Economic Anthropology	The SEA invites both undergraduate and graduate students to submit papers on any aspect of economic anthropology or economic archaeology. Papers should contain a central thesis or argument, should be neither wholly descriptive nor wholly theoretical but, ideally, both and should be edited for clarity. Manuscripts should be in English only and be no longer than 8,000 words, including endnotes and references, and in <i>American Anthropologist</i> style.	June 1
Nancy "Penny" Schwartz Undergraduate Student Essay Award	Association for Africanist Anthropology	The prize is awarded to the best undergraduate paper in Africanist anthropology. In determining the award, the following criteria will be applied: Originality of scholarship, creativity of insight, and quality of writing. A well-argued and innovative perspective on a current issue of concern to Africanist and African diaspora scholarship or to the issues facing Africa more generally. Clear potential for supporting future research at the graduate level or beyond. Special consideration will be given to undergraduates planning to pursue a career in anthropology or in service and education on the African continent. Original research involving primary materials or fieldwork is useful, but not essential for consideration.	June 30
Sylvia Forman Prize	Association for Feminist Anthropology	We encourage essays in all four subfields of anthropology. Essays may be based on research on a wide variety of topics including (but not limited to) feminist analysis of women's work, education, reproduction, sexuality, religion, and expressive culture, language, family and kin relations, economic development, gender and material culture, gender and biology, women and development, globalization, and intersectionalities of gender, race, sexuality, and class.	June 30
Annual Student Essay Prize	Society for Linguistic Anthropology	Annual student essay competition at both undergraduate and graduate levels. In order to be eligible for one of these awards, the applicant must have been either a graduate or undergraduate student in a degree-granting program when the paper was written; must be the sole author of the paper; and must submit the paper no more than two years after it was written. The paper should be suitable for submission to the Journal of Linguistic Anthropology and at the time of submission for this competition, the paper must not have been published or submitted for publication. W.H.R. Rivers Undergraduate Student Paper Prize	Society for Medical Anthropology	Given for an outstanding paper in medical anthropology written by an undergraduate student. Papers must have been written while the applicant was a student, in this or the preceding academic year only.	July 1
Condon Prize for Best Student Essay in Psychological Anthropology	Society for Psychological Anthropology	Psychological anthropology is defined broadly to include interrelationships among psychological, social and cultural phenomena. Essays will be judged on their relevance to psychological anthropology, organization and clarity, and their theoretical and methodological strengths. The author must be an undergraduate or graduate student on July 15, 2017, but the author need not be a current member of the Society for Psychological Anthropology.	July 15
Christine Wilson Award	Society for the Anthropology of Food and Nutrition	Papers may report on research undertaken in whole or in part by the author. Co-authored work is acceptable, provided that submitting student is first author. Papers must have as their primary focus an anthropological approach to the study of food and/or nutrition and must present original, empirical research; literature reviews are not eligible. Papers that propose a new conceptual framework or outline novel research designs or methodological approaches are especially welcome. Students (undergraduate or graduate) must be currently enrolled or enrolled during in the past academic year.	July 28
