

# APPLICATION TIMELINE

## for GRADUATE SCHOOL for Masters and/or Ph.D

Junior Year (or 18 mo. prior to planned matriculation) March - August	Senior Year (12 months before) September - November	Senior Year (9 mo prior) December - March	Senior Year (6 mo prior) April - August
<p>Research programs: resources include Reed faculty, discipline leaders; career services library, staff and website; alumni</p> <p>Meet with faculty to discuss interest, discipline specific issues, letters of recommendation, etc.</p> <p>Prepare for GRE and if required, subject tests. Subject tests dates held in April, Oct, and Nov. (more detail see <a href="http://www.ets.org">www.ets.org</a>)</p> <p>Take GRE and subject tests prior to school starting in the fall.</p> <p>Prepare personal statement (career services offers workshops in fall and spring semesters)</p> <p>Investigate fellowships and awards through Reed: see <a href="http://www.reed.edu/academic/student-grants/">www.reed.edu/academic/student-grants/</a></p> <p>Visit targeted graduate programs during summer travels if possible.</p> <p>Recommended resources:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Graduate Admissions Essays, Don Asher (strategies and essay prep)</li> <li>2) Writing Personal Statements, Joe Schall</li> </ol>	<p>Apply 6 weeks prior to deadline for admission and funding advantage.</p> <p>Prepare personal statement writing (several drafts, several readers )</p> <p>Prepare resume or curriculum vitae</p> <p>Request faculty recommendations –3-4 weeks in advance and provide personal statement and self- addressed stamped envelope as needed.</p> <p>Request transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended (Reed needs 2 weeks notice)</p> <p>Seek funding; contact Graduate Fellowship Office at programs ; career services library and website.</p> <p>Submit necessary funding applications.</p> <p>Take GRE (score reports 10 – 15 days after testing) Test scores needed for application to be complete.</p> <p>Register for subject tests in September.</p>	<p>Contact programs to insure completion of application.</p> <p>Update applications by contacting programs with fall semester grades.</p> <p>Prepare for interviews: meet with faculty for questions to anticipate; participate in mock interviews with career services.</p> <p>Continue pursuit of funding: discuss possible opportunities with discipline leaders with whom you have been in contact.</p>	<p>Choose a program: degree completion record, destination of graduates, assistantship and funding offer, personal fit.</p> <p>Visit programs for final decision.</p> <p>Write and thank references with updates of your success.</p> <p>Update Reed through career services and department on outcomes.</p>
