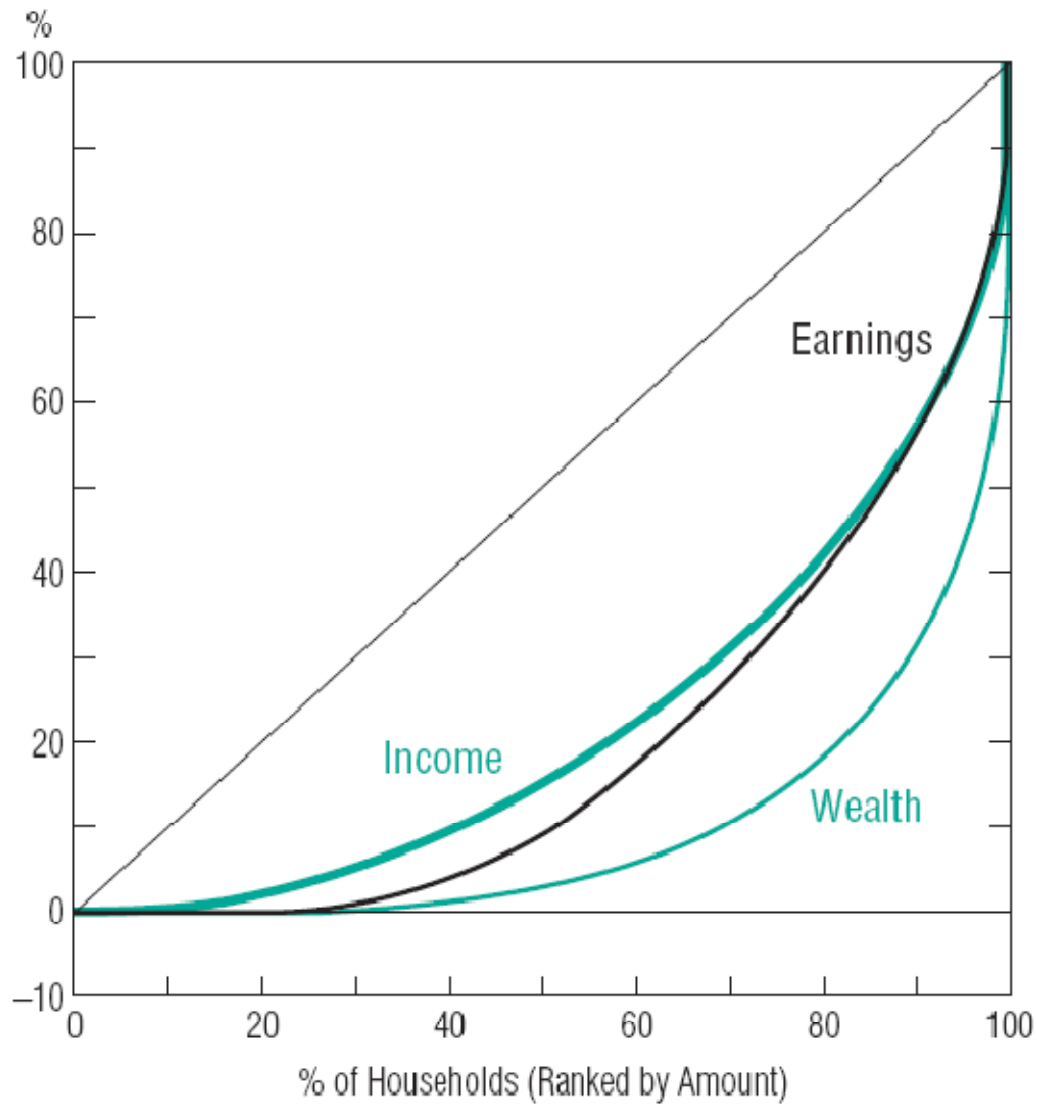

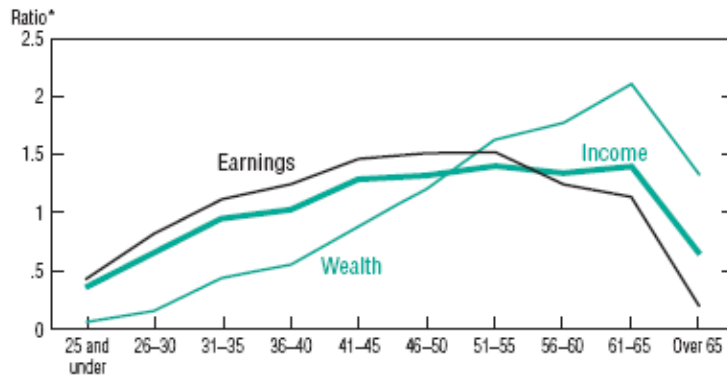

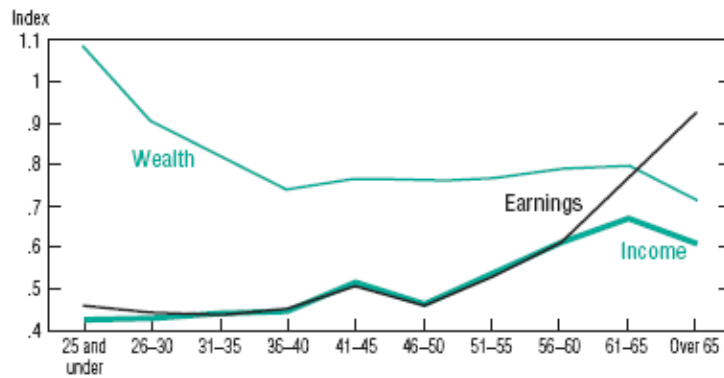
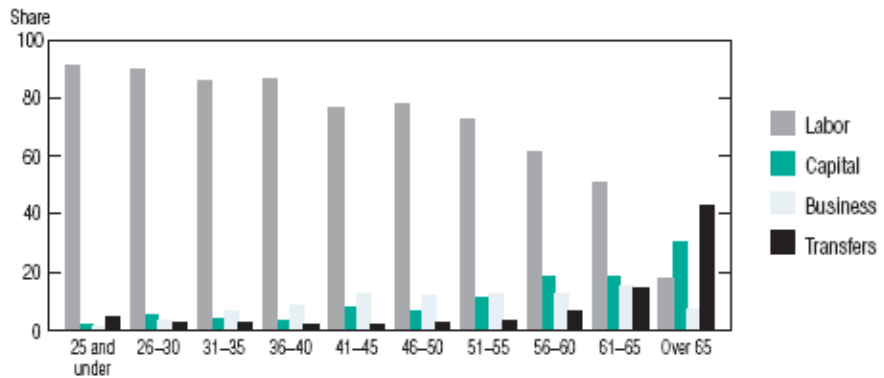

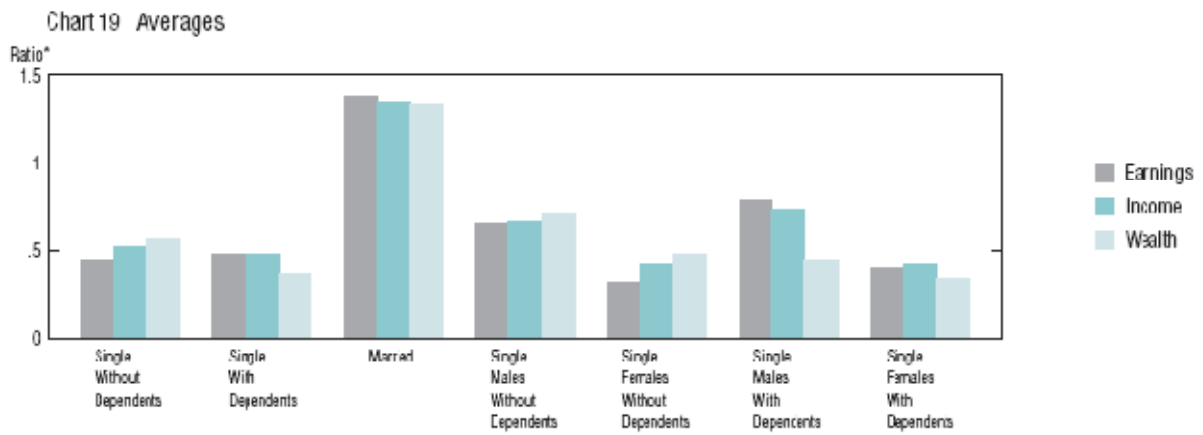
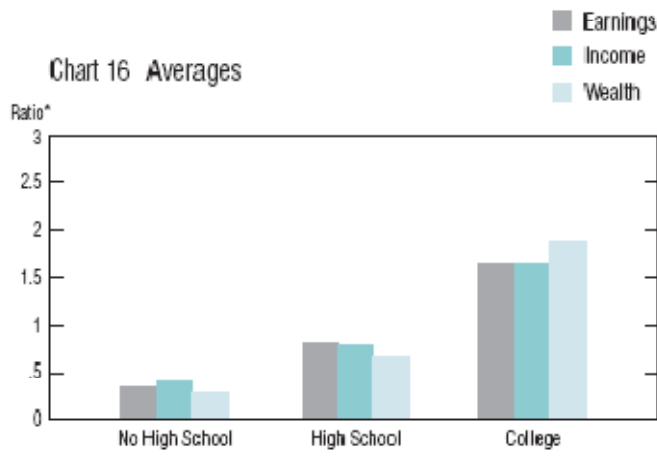
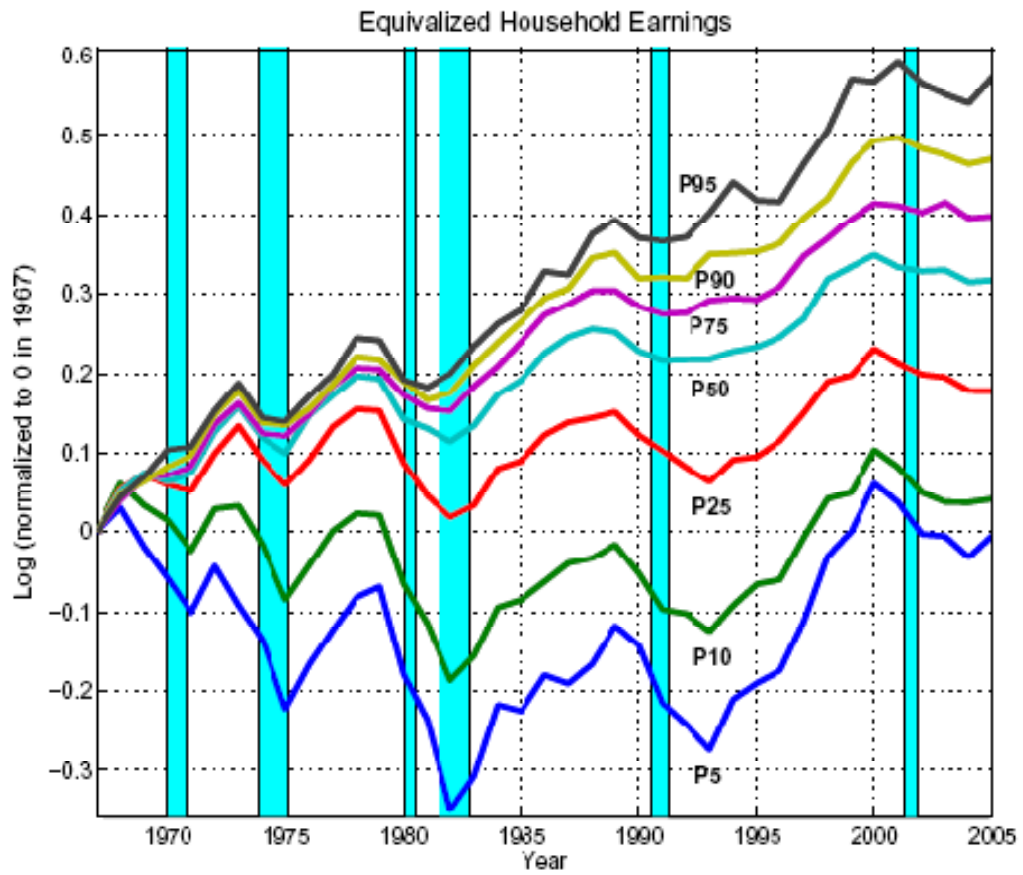


Figure 9: Percentiles of the household earnings distribution (CPS). Shaded areas are NBER recessions.



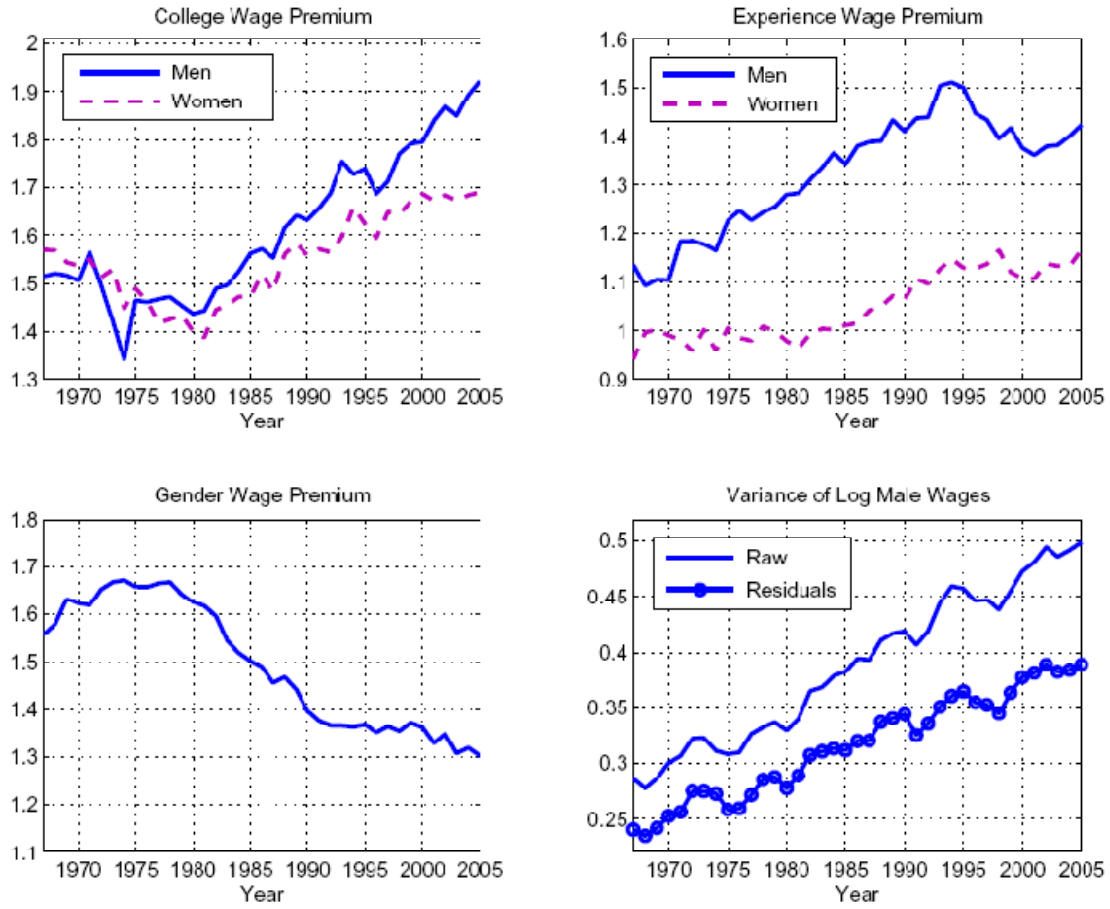


Figure 5: Education, experience, gender wage premia, and residual wage inequality (CPS)
