



## MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

To be admitted to the ICPS program, a student must petition the ICPS Committee for acceptance into upper-division standing.

### A. HOME DEPARTMENT REQUIREMENTS (ICPS PRIMARY FIELD 1):

1. Anthropology 211  \_\_\_\_\_
2. Five additional anthropology courses, at least one of which should be an area course (preferably two)  \_\_\_\_\_
3. Statistics: one of Polisci 311, Math 141, Econ 311 or 312, Soc 311, or Psy 348  \_\_\_\_\_
4. Language: Proficiency in a non-English language as demonstrated by successful completion of secondary education in that language, successful completion of two units of college-level courses in that language at a second-year level or one unit at a higher level, successful completion of a language placement examination approved by the committee, or approval by the committee.  \_\_\_\_\_  
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### B. ICPS CORE REQUIREMENTS (ICPS PRIMARY FIELD 2):

Any one from the following (A-C):

- A. Economics 201 (Introduction to Economics Analysis) and three ICPS-economics courses  \_\_\_\_\_
- B. Political Science 220, 240 or 260 and three additional ICPS-political science courses, two of which must be upper level  \_\_\_\_\_  
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- C. Sociology 211 and three ICPS-sociology courses  \_\_\_\_\_

### C. ICPS SECONDARY FIELD:

Any one from the following in an additional field not used as a primary field:

- A. Economics 201 and one ICPS-economics course  \_\_\_\_\_
- B. Political science 220, 240, or 260 and one upper-level ICPS-political science course  \_\_\_\_\_
- C. Any two ICPS-history courses, only one of which may be in American history
- D. Sociology 211 and one ICPS-sociology course

**Notes:** No course can count towards more than one group. 200-level Humanities courses not used for the Humanities requirement can apply to either Group 1 or Group 2, but not both. A maximum of 2 units can come from language courses. If 2 units are being taken in language courses, the 2 units must be in the same language.
