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## MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

### A. REQUIREMENTS:

- Linguistics 211
- Linguistics 212
- Five additional courses in linguistics (or cross-listed in linguistics)

- Language requirement: evidence of academic study of two languages other than the student's native language(s), equivalent to at least second-year college-level proficiency in one language, and at least first-year college-level proficiency in the second. This requirement may be fulfilled with language courses and/or placement exams.  \_\_\_\_\_
- A total of four semester units in an allied field, none of which can be used to fulfill any of the above. Some examples:
  - a) Anthropology 211 plus three additional anthropology courses (including linguistics courses cross-listed with anthropology);
  - b) four units in psychology, including the introductory courses;
  - c) four courses from a single department in the Division of Literature and Languages, or four courses in comparative literature;
  - d) four courses in mathematics;

**Notes:** No course can count towards more than one group. 200-level Humanities courses not used for the Humanities requirement can apply to either Group 1 or Group 2, but not both. A maximum of 2 units can come from language courses. If 2 units are being taken in language courses, the 2 units must be in the same language.
