



## MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

*This program is for the student whose interests are divided between the two fields and whose goals are not served by a major in either Ancient Mediterranean Studies or religion. The primary fields for which the program is well suited are early Christianity (including Byzantine and medieval Christianity), Judaism in the Hellenistic period or under the Roman Empire, and pagan Greek and Roman religious practice. Before the junior year, the student considering this program should consult with a member of the Ancient Mediterranean Studies–Religion Interdisciplinary Committee. A petition for acceptance into the major should include a statement describing the student’s rationale for combining the two fields.*
